

The Chapel of Saint-André was built in 1646. Maintained and used for three centuries, it served Sarreyens who dreamed of a larger place of worship. Once the necessary funds had been raised, a new chapel was built and inaugurated in 1935; no longer in the village square, but at the lower end of the village. Parts of the old building were reused for the new one: four columns, the bell tower spire and some of the stained glass windows. The cross, which stood in front of the former chapel, is hanging on the side of this building.
